Accreditation Updates

Required Education Programs

As you may have heard, our Mandatory Educational Programs are rolling out starting THIS quarter. **Due to our first SFL Quarterly Community Meeting being pushed back to October 6th, and our FIRST Educational Program happening on October 5th**, we wanted to get a message out to you ASAP to clarify these new annual education requirements for your chapter to remain an accredited and recognized sorority/fraternity at UC Davis.

AT LEAST 70% of your chapter must attend all 4 Educational Programs (based on your Winter 2016 roster) by Spring 2017 to remain an accredited and recognized sorority/fraternity at UC Davis for the 2017-18 academic year.

Background and Future Plan

The University of California Office of the President identifies Athletics, Greek Life, and the Marching Band as 'high-risk' student groups on campus and are therefore required to receive additional education around sexual violence prevention, alcohol safety, anti-hazing, and cultural awareness and sensitivity.

As a result, OSFL has partnered with departments on campus to host these programs to ensure we meet these requirements as a community.

As a community, if we can reach 90% participation in all 4 Educational Programs, the office plans to transition the educational requirements to only new members/new initiates - therefore as new members come in and attend the program, the entire organization will have participated in the required Educational Programs.

First Educational Program - Sexual Assault Prevention, October 5th at 6pm

There will be limited seating at each program, and less slots will be available as the quarters pass. Get them done EARLY so you don't have to worry about scrambling last minute to get members signed up by Spring.

The deadline to sign up for ALL Fall Programs will be 10/10/16, but be sure to sign up for this first Fall program before October 4th.
